



Continuing Professional Development for Engineers in Kentucky

A new law in Kentucky requiring continuing education for engineers became effective June 26, 2007 and a regulation has been promulgated to implement the statute change.

The regulation ([201 KAR 18:196](#)) calls for engineers to verify compliance with the continuing education requirements on their license renewal form. The regulation would require 30 hours of continuing education in the two calendar years preceeding the June 30 renewal.

Therefore:

- For those licensees whose last names begin with L-Z, on their June 30, 2010 renewal they would need the 30 hours in calendar years 2008 and 2009.
- For those licensees whose last names begin with A-K, on their June 30, 2011 renewal they would need the 30 hours in calendar years 2009 and 2010.

Note: Those engineers who were licensed in Kentucky before 1972 are exempt from the continuing education requirements if they have been continuously licensed and have had no disciplinary actions.
